(Indianapolis, IN) - The **American Family Association of Indiana PAC** announced that it has endorsed **Mike Delph** for State Senator in Indiana Senate District 29.

Hoosiers have witnessed enormous changes over the last two years with an economic collapse, historic government takeovers of private industries, massive and unprecedented federal spending and the promotion of all sorts of left-of-center political agendas coming from Washington, DC. When the 2010 elections occur in just 56 days, AFA of Indiana PAC predicts that tens of thousands of Hoosiers will be looking for candidates who still hold firm to the values of the heartland of America. Mike Delph is one of those legislators who has consistently represented the common sense values of Hoosiers in his State Senate district. Mike Delph puts people above politics.

“Those voters who want fiscal responsibility in government, care about the importance of the family and the challenges they face, respect the sanctity of life, and are troubled by the hostile, sex-saturated culture in which children are raised, should take note of the record of State Senator Mike Delph,” said AFA of Indiana PAC president, **Micah Clark**.

First elected in 2005, in his first few years in office Senator Delph has not shied away from tackling some of the biggest issues of the day. Senator Delph fought for the religious liberty of legislators and invited guests of the General Assembly in their ability to pray without censorship from a federal judge. Senator Delph has repeatedly led the legislature in attempts to address the problems of illegal immigration. This Spring, Senator Delph authored legislation which attempted to protect children from unsolicited sexually explicit text messages that passed the Indiana Senate with unanimous support. Senator Delph has also stood up in calling for ethics and lobby reforms.

“I strongly encourage voters in Senate District 29 to stand with Mike Delph this November. Mike is a breath of fresh air in Hoosier politics. Mike places principles above politics, taxpayers over tax spenders and families above far-left agendas, Clark said.
